FOOTNOTES

- ¹ Prior to enrolling in junior business courses, students must: have earned at least 60 semester hours; have a GPA of 2.0 or better in the combined series in MATH, ACIS, BIT, and ECON courses with no grade lower than a C- in any of these courses; and have a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better for all coursework. In order to graduate, students must have an overall GPA of at least 2.0 and an in-major GPA of at least 2.0.
- ² In addition to the Freshman English/Communication Skills requirement, students must complete another six credit hours from approved Writing Intensive (WI) courses, three of which must be within their major (see senior year).
- ³ Completes the University Core Requirement in Area 5: Quantitative and Symbolic Reasoning.
- ⁴ Effective for students entering Fall 2003 and thereafter, there has been an administrative waiver of the two credit hours of related laboratory courses as stipulated in Area 4 of the Undergraduate University Core. **IMPORTANT NOTE:** this waiver does **not** eliminate any credit hours from the total 125 credits required for graduation. The two credit hours eliminated from Area 4 must be made up as free electives.
- ⁵ Social science courses should be selected from any courses in Economics (beyond Principles), Geography, History (except 1024, 1025, 1026, and 2054), International Studies, Political Science (except 3015-3016), Psychology, and Sociology; or any course approved for Area 3 of the University Core.
- ⁶ ECON 2005 and 2006 will satisfy the University Core Requirement in Area 3: Society and Human Behavior.
- ⁷ COMM 2004 Public Speaking is required for all Business majors who did not take COMM 1015-1016. It may be completed in the sophomore, junior or senior year.
- ⁸ Free electives must include at least one hour from the University Core Area 6: Creativity and Aesthetic Experience. The University Core Area 7: Critical Issues in a Global Context, may be used to meet another requirement or taken as a free elective.
